Grow your own cut flowers

Sweet pea (Vase life: 3-7 days)

The ultimate 'cut and come again' cut flower! Once a popular glasshouse cut flower, these beautiful blooms are mainly garden grown nowadays. There are plenty of colours to choose from, but a good mix of shades makes the prettiest posies. Old fashioned Grandiflora types often have the best scent such as Sweet Pea 'Heirloom Mixed'. But the popular modern varieties such as Sweet Pea 'Alan Titchmarsh' combine fragrance, larger blooms and longer stems that are ideal for flower arrangements.

Garden Jobs for July

- 1) Cut back faded perennial plants to keep borders tidy.
- 2) Continue to tie in and train new growth on climbing plants.
- 3) Prune lupins to encourage further flowers.
- 4) Keep an eye out for pests on plants, early treatment is best.
- 5) Cuttings can still be taken from shrubs and herbaceous perennials.
